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Our Mission and Purpose

SDBFC Foundation was started in 2016 to meet the need of families who couldn't afford lactation services from a lactation consultant (IBCLC). Over the years our mission has expanded to address the stark disparities among black and brown communities, where there are more barriers and challenges in accessing culturally congruent lactation services. We focus on meeting the need by providing free and low-cost chest/breastfeeding consultations, expanding access into San Diego's "first foods deserts," and increasing representation among lactation professionals through scholarships and support grants.

893 free/reduced fee lactation consultations

In 2024, the SDBFC Foundation provided an outstanding amount of free/reduced-fee lactation consultations across San Diego County. We provided a total of 893 total visits at the La Mesa, Southeast, and Banker's Hill locations. These consultations helped families overcome chest/breastfeeding, pumping, and bottlefeeding challenges, as well as increased parental confidence, thereby extending the duration of the families' chest/breastfeeding journeys. More human milk for babies = better longterm health outcomes for our communities!

4 Feeding Our Future Scholarships awarded to BIPOC Lactation Students

As part of our Feeding our Future campaign, the scholarship program was created to eliminate the barriers for BIPOC individuals who want to pursue a career in lactation, and to nurture a sustainable network of BIPOC lactation professionals for our future candidates. In 2024, we distributed \$8,000 for 4 scholarships and support grants, bringing our total to 36 awards distributed since Fall of 2021. Our program graduates have already begun their careers as lactation professionals in their communities! Over the next year, it is our intention to seek more funding to provide more opportunities to eligible candidates.

Our Clinic Sites

Our clinic sites have undergone big changes in 2024. The incredible IBCLCs at both locations have continued to offer our communities incredible support through free or low-cost private consultations. Melanin Milk SD clinic location has moved from Southeast to Mission Valley, a more central part of San Diego. Additionally, that clinic now has two clinicians, both BIPOC, including a Spanish speaking IBCLC. Unfortunately due to unforeseen circumstances our previous third clinic at Baker's Hill has closed. However, we are actively seeking partnerships with more BIPOC clinicians to provide services and reopen a third location and eventually a fourth! 
